Stewardship Sunday is November 3rd, and this is the day Concordia Lutheran Church begins our

On this Sunday, the church appeals to your sense of responsibility to serving our church selflessly and generously.

Starting something new is always hard and for many of our preschoolers, this is their very first school experience. We started the school year with a few tears and some anxiety about exactly what preschool would feel like and ended our month feeling confident that we were made

to learn here at Share and Care with our new friends and teachers.

We were blessed by returning preschoolers who led by example and also, sometimes, by holding the hand of our new friends. We love that they have grown so accustomed to being a Share and Care learner, that they are willing to share their confidence with others who are less sure. We also continue to hear stories of former preschoolers sending their kiddos to have the Share and Care Preschool experience. Serving generations of learners in this place is such an awesome legacy for this Concordia ministry.

As we look forward to more learning in the month of October we will be focusing our play around Farms. We will read <u>Big Red Barn</u> by Margaret Wise Brown as well as <u>Little Blue Truck</u> by Alice Schertle. We will investigate apples in our discovery center and have a variety of farm art projects for our kiddos to choose to complete in the art center.
